

Application for a national visa Family Reunion for Spouses of German citizens

For the application you require the following documents:



e) if the marriage did not take place in India or in Germany: marriage certificate with
apostille/ legalization, if applicable
Birth certificate issued under the "Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1969"
School certificate: matriculation certificate or Middle School Board Certificate or school
leaving certificate including the date of birth
Proof of Residence in India : Aadhaar Card or Ration card of the applicant covering the past 4 years <u>or</u> Voter's ID; if a non-Indian residing in India: visa/residence permit for India
If applicable: Divorce judgement and decree of all former marriages of both spouses,
German divorce judgement with "Rechtskraftvermerk", which confirms that the judgment is
final
If applicable: Certificate of death of former spouse
Proof of German knowledge (A1 level):
"Start Deutsch 1" from Goethe-Institute or "Start Deutsch 1" of telc GmbH (The European Language Certificate) or "Grundstufe Deutsch 1" of the Austrian Language Diploma (ÖSD)

In case a document is not set up in German or English, it has to be submitted together with a <u>notary</u> <u>attested translation into English.</u>

All documents need to be presented in original plus TWO copies (A4 size). Please DO NOT STAPLE any documents

Please note that the German Mission in India reserves the right to request additional documents or initiate a further investigation and verification of documents.

The submission of the above-mentioned documents does not guarantee that a visa is granted. Submission of incomplete documentation or refusal to appear for a visa interview may result in the rejection of your application. Making untrue statements and/or handing in documents that do not reflect the truth will result in a rejection of your application
