



Checklist for a German National Visa

-family reunion for children to accompany one or both parents to Germany- (Dependents of highly qualified employees / BlueCard Holders)

Please make sure that you present **all** the documents applicable as per the checklist when taking your appointment at VFS Global. Failure to do so may result in our inability to process your application and you having to book a new appointment.

Facilitated visa procedure for “dependents” is only available within 6 months of visa issuance to the person of reference (BlueCard holder etc.). If you apply later, please refer to the checklist for family reunion visas.

<input type="checkbox"/>	Valid passport (issued within the last 10 years and valid for at least another year as of date of visa application; passports with observations regarding name, date of birth, place of birth and sex cannot be accepted); passport must have at least two empty pages
<input type="checkbox"/>	Application form, declaration form and contact information form duly filled & signed
<input type="checkbox"/>	Personal covering letter from the parents explaining the exact purpose and duration of stay
<input type="checkbox"/>	Copy of the first and last page and all pages containing entry stamps/visas of your passport (A4 size copy)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Copy of the first and last page and all pages containing entry stamps/visas of parents' passport (A4 size copy)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Copy of parents' visa or residence permit (“Aufenthaltstitel”) , if applicable
<input type="checkbox"/>	School certificate mentioning parentage and date of birth, if applicable
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Proof of marriage of parents (only if application not filed together with parents):</p> <p>a) if the marriage was performed according to the Hindu Marriage Act:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Marriage registration certificate - Temple <u>or</u> Gurudwara <u>or</u> Priest certificate - Conversion certificate, if applicable - Several photographs showing that the essential rites have been performed (i.a. Pheras, Saptapadi/ Anand Karaj) <p>b) if the marriage was performed according to Sharia Law:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Marriage registration certificate - Nikahnama - Conversion certificate, if applicable - Several photographs (i.e. bridal couple signing the Nikahnama, Qazi, witnesses) <p>c) if the marriage was performed according to Special Marriage Act (“Court Marriage”, “Civil Marriage”)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Certificate of Marriage according to Section 13 Special Marriage Act - Photographs of marriage or function <p>d) if the marriage was performed according to the Christian Marriage Act:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Marriage registration certificate, if Compulsory Registration Marriage Act is in force - Marriage certificate issued by licensed Church - Conversion certificate, if applicable - Photographs of marriage or function

	e) if the marriage did not take place in India or in Germany : marriage certificate with apostille/ legalization, if applicable
<input type="checkbox"/>	Birth certificate issued under the “Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1969”
<input type="checkbox"/>	Divorce judgment and decree of parents , if applicable
<input type="checkbox"/>	Death certificate of parent , if applicable
<input type="checkbox"/>	Only in case of family reunion with a non-German parent in Germany: If the other parent continues to reside permanently in India , parent in Germany needs to prove sole custody (e.g. custody order in divorce decree, custody decree) if parents are divorced, OR if parents are still married, declaration of consent to be signed by parent remaining in India in person at the German Mission.
<input type="checkbox"/>	2 passport pictures according to biometric specifications, not older than 6 months
<input type="checkbox"/>	Visa fee

Please prepare two identical application sets consisting of copies of the above-mentioned documents and bring all your original certificates along. Please DO NOT staple any documents.

Minors have to be accompanied by their legal guardian or third person duly authorized by the legal guardian by presenting a written authorization attested by a German notary public together with a valid photo-ID or submitting the [declaration of consent](#).

In case a document is not set up in German or English, it has to be submitted together with a notary attested English translation.

Please note that the German Missions reserve the right to ask for additional documents or to initiate a further investigation of certificates, for which additional fees would be charged. [Click here](#) to find out about the charges for the verification.

Please ensure that you have family health cover through your parent. Until health cover has been established you might want to take a travel health insurance (Kindly refer to www.india.diplo.de/visa to find out about the travel health insurances accepted).

Submission of the above-mentioned documents does not guarantee that a visa will be granted. Submission of incomplete documentation or refusal to appear for a visa interview will delay your application and may result in the rejection of your application.
